Loyola Marymount University is seeking a Director of Chicano Latino Student Services (CLSS). CLSS is an office within Ethnic and Intercultural Services (EIS) and reports to the EIS Lead Director. The position is responsible for administering ethnic specific programming and other student development programs for Chicano/Latino students with the aim of nurturing the whole student.
