DESCRIPTION:

This position is for a Clinical/Community Psychologist specializing in multiculturalism, social justice, organizational behavior changes, and positive psychology-strength based approaches. Primary responsibilities will be addressing the social/psychological experiences of African American and Latin-American students to foster their successful matriculation and academic success at UC San Diego. Expertise and interest in the first year experience and ongoing development of male university students of color is required, in tandem with an extensive history of community engagement, and demonstrated successful outcomes. The incumbent will also perform psychological evaluations, brief therapy and consultation, psycho-educational programming outreach services, and supervision and training for the unit's APA accredited pre-doctoral internship program.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- * PhD in Clinical/Counseling Psychology and license/license eligibility in CA.
- * Expertise in working with a diverse student population and traditionally underrepresented student groups, especially male university students and students of African American and Latin-American background preferred.
- * Knowledge and skills associated with community psychology, multiculturalism and social justice, strength based psychological models, leadership development, and supervision.
- * Ability to work well and energetically in a fast paced environment with changing priorities, serving a large volume of students effectively on an appointment or walk-in bases, and accepting responsibility for actions to punctually meeting deadlines in a service environment requiring effective self management.
- * Ability to identify, define, innovate, initiate, and evaluate programs and to plan and develop strategies and solutions in a complex organization.
- * Strong communication skills and oral presentations.
- * Ability to actively interact with ease, productively, and functionally with colleagues, supervisors, and members of the campus community to maintain a positive and cooperative working environment and relationships.
