

The Department of Psychological Sciences at the University of Portland (UP) seeks a tenure-track assistant professor in community psychology, cross cultural psychology, or a related field to begin August 2020. Research that incorporates issues relevant to diverse groups and life experiences is particularly encouraged, especially surrounding issues such as mental health, well-being, and inclusion. The candidate will be expected to teach a combination of upper-level and introductory undergraduate courses, including general psychology, cross-cultural or community psychology, and new courses aligned with their interests. We are especially interested in candidates capable of teaching courses in qualitative methods and/or with interest in developing internship opportunities for students. The teaching load is normally 3 x 3-credit courses per semester.

A Ph.D. in psychology or related field (or evidence of completion by the time of appointment) is required. Commitment to and success in undergraduate teaching is essential. The successful candidate will also demonstrate the desire and ability to engage undergraduates in productive scholarship. In addition, the successful candidate will have demonstrated knowledge, skills, and success in diversity & inclusion work within or transferable to higher education; discussion of these attributes may be embedded in the cover letter and the teaching statement but should also be described in a standalone diversity statement.

A complete application will include a cover letter, curriculum vitae, a statement of teaching philosophy, a research statement, a statement of interest/experience in diversity and inclusion, and the names of three references from whom we can solicit letters of recommendations (letter writers will automatically be sent emails with specific directions about how and where to upload their letters.)
